Ronald McMahon

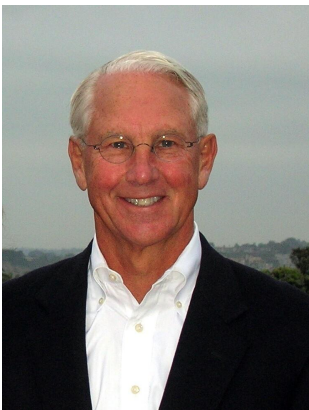
